
# 2 MINUTES WITH ..... JANICE NARAYAN

In this job we see the most unusual items donated ..... anything from an urn with pet's ashes, drugs in handbags (we have strict procedures to adhere to with these items) to the most mundane kitchen utensils.

Rubbish and donations left at our door overnight cause us much stress and extra clean-up work. We are unable to use these goods to on-sell due to Health and Safety, and rodents run all over the goods during the night!

Currently I am working towards completing my Retail Management studies, which I am enjoying.

What are some interesting things about you that local people may not know? As manager of the Family Store, I manage a team of 15 people of which over half are volunteers, who specialise and have a passion about the areas they work in, be it electrical, toys, games, clothing, books, china or merchandising.

I coordinate pick-up and deliveries of goods donated and sold.

Our store helps fund the local food bank and our Youth and Community worker.

We work with our Youth and Community worker to provide household goods to struggling families in our community.
