TAWA COMMUNITY CIVIC AWARDS CEREMONY

The biennial civic awards ceremony took place at the Tawa Community Centre on Friday 20 June, with the Mayor presenting certificates to around 47 people or groups to thank them for the voluntary service they provide in this community. The occasion went off well, with Malcolm Sparrow, WCC councillor, and Robert Tredger, Tawa Community Board chair, reading out the citations for all those who had been nominated.



There were seven categories, with a winner chosen in each of those categories. They each received a Parker pen and their certificate was framed! They also receive a little more "recognition". The main aim of the ceremony however is to show appreciation to everyone whose name is submitted and to express gratitude for what they do to improve the quality of life for the rest of us!

DOG EXERCISE AREAS IN TAWA



There's been some discussion on neighbourly.co.nz recently regarding the whereabouts of the various dog exercise areas in Tawa.

The Council have designated portions of certain parks as official dog exercise areas. "Woof woof ruff" is the terminology they use, or maybe that's no longer the case!

Dogowners need to be aware that the WCC dog bylaw requires dogs to be "under control" at all times, even in a dog exercise area. Dog exercise areas in Grasslees Reserve, Duncan Reserve and Willowbank Park do not extend to the adjoining playground areas.

Dog exercise areas in Tawa as listed on the on the WCC website at <http://wellington.govt.nz/services/consents-and-licences/dogs/exercise-areas/maps> are:

1. Arthur Carman Park, Collins Ave – open to dogs 1 November to 31 January only
2. Duncan Park, Linden Ave – southern part of park between stream and the Main Road
3. Grasslees Reserve, Main Road – western side of stream to the Main Road
4. Taylor Park, off Tawa St – southern area of park behind badminton hall
5. Willowbank Park, Main Road south – area north of hall (in Boscobel Lane) and area on eastern side of the stream

U3A TAWA

The second semester of U3A Tawa begins in July with a number of new courses. Michael Holland will have more traveller's tales entitled "On Your Bike"; Mary-Lynn Boyes will offer "Katherine Mansfield's War"; Francine McGovern has "Singing for Everyone". Then there'll be a "Golf lesson", "Mahjong for Beginners", a "Power Point Computer Class" and a talk on "Technology Gadgets".

Bruce Murray will again offer "Tawa History", and a law firm will deal with "Legal Issues for Seniors". Bay Audiology will present a session on "Hearing Loss and How to Deal with it" and Jonathan Boyes presents "New Zealand Company Migrants". There will also be a "Film Outings" group in addition to the "Theatre Outings".

Many courses offered by Tawa's U3A are continuous. There is still a Book Group, Art Group, French Language and Culture. You can still attend Music Nostalgia, Opera, and Women's Choir. here are several Craft Groups, Discussion Groups, and Fitness Programmes.

The philosophy of U3A is that learning is a sharing of expertise. People with knowledge in a specific field volunteer to lead a course or series of talks and the members choose to attend. There is no charge for attendance (apart from a small donation for use of the church hall if such is used) nor are the leaders paid. However there is an annual subscription of \$10 to join the U3A which entitles members to attend any number of courses.

The U3A movement (originally the University of the 3rd Age) was established in the 70s in France and is now active throughout the world. Unlike a University, however, it has no entrance requirements, it does not hold exams nor does it award diplomas, degrees or certificates.
