"TAWA GOES TO TOWN" – DON'T MISS IT!

This iconic Tawa event takes place just once every two years. This year it's happening on Tuesday evening, 20 September at the Michael Fowler Centre. The Tawa Schools' & Community Music Festival includes a choir from every school in Tawa, plus musicians and dancers from the schools and adults from the wider community. The show involves more than 700 performers, plus all the wonderful people "behind the scenes", mostly from the Tawa community.



Tickets for "Tawa Goes To Town" are now on sale at a cost of \$26 for an adult and \$10 for a child (14 years and under), available through Ticketek. Those prices are lower than previously, in an attempt to ensure that the event is affordable for everyone.

Note from the Ed: I can thoroughly recommend this show. This will be the 10th time I've been since



arriving in Tawa in 1996. My daughters have long since left the Tawa schooling system (although one is now teaching locally), but I still very much enjoy this special occasion. It involves down-to-earth music with many pieces accompanied by either energetic dancers on stage, or colourful props used by all those taking part – and sometimes both! Many hours of practice on the part of all the singers and the accompanying musical team go into making a brilliant performance!

EDITOR WANTED FOR CONSERVATION NEWSLETTER

An editor is needed for the local conservation group's newsletter. Friends of Tawa Bush Reserves (FOTBR) is a volunteer group dedicated to serving the Tawa community by caring for and enhancing Tawa's bush. We are looking for a volunteer to write an occasional e-newsletter for our membership.

Over the last fourteen years the group has undertaken tree planting, track building, pest plant and animal control and monitoring, and lobbied for the further protection and preservation of bush areas in Tawa. These efforts have been recognised by the Tawa and Wellington City communities with local and regional awards, and with the revival of the bush as evidenced by the increase in native birds and the decrease in pest numbers. Many residents of Tawa enjoy the fruits of FOTBR's labours whether it is by walking in the bush or viewing birds in their own gardens.

An important means of keeping our members informed and engaged has been through an e-newsletter, the "Bush Telegraph". This is a way of sharing recent developments, successes, challenges and opportunities. Leaders within FOTBR can provide the raw material – your job would be to pester us for material, and then turn it into something interesting for our members. If we could get four Bush Telegraphs published each year, that would be great.

UP-TO-DATE INFO ON A FEW KEY GROUPS IN TAWA

• TAWA COMMUNITY BOARD

This is a group of six elected members and two appointed city councillors under the 'umbrella' of the Wellington City Council.

Elections take place every three years in line with regular council elections. WCC's website states: "This elected community board represents the interests of the Tawa Community. The board reflects the unique history and requirements of the area and helps Wellington City Council to understand and meet the community's needs."

Some of the responsibilities of the community board are:

- representing and acting as an advocate for the interests of the Tawa community
- considering and reporting on any matter referred to it by Wellington City Council and any issues of interest to the Tawa Community Board
- maintaining an overview of services provided by Wellington City Council within the Tawa community

• TAWA BUSINESS GROUP

Tawa Business is a group of passionate local business owners, property owners and Tawa community members who would like to help make Tawa a better place to live, work and visit.

An internationally recognised approach to doing this would be the establishment of a Business Improvement District (BID) in Tawa.

A BID would provide the foundation for a strong business association to represent Tawa, that is sustainably funded through a reasonable targeted rate on businesses and commercial properties within

a BID boundary. This Tawa BID establishment project will consider options for where a BID boundary might be set.

A BID would use its funding for the ongoing betterment of the Tawa town centre, for example collective marketing efforts, advocating for further investment into Tawa from stakeholders such as the Wellington City Council or addressing shared issues such as graffiti, poorly presented retail space or crime within the town centre.

• TAWA TOWN CENTRE UPGRADE

Happening at the same time as the Tawa BID project is the Tawa Town Centre Upgrade project. Led by Wellington City Council, this project is now in the final stages of consultation and will see \$1 million invested by the Council into the look and feel of the Tawa town centre.

- Surrey Street roundabout
- raised pedestrian crossing
- gateway features
- Essex Street junction
- planted central median strip
- Tawa Plaza upgrade


