



#### LED STREETLIGHTS NEAR OUTLET CITY

Many of the lights in Tawa have now been turned up and are operating at full capacity. But that isn't the case with all of them. One particular stretch of road where 12 consecutive streetlights have been completely out of action is the eastern side of Tawa's Main Road between Redwood Estate (formerly Redwood Village) and Outlet City. Council was informed of this some weeks ago.

Wellington Electricity, an independent company, is responsible for fixing network faults such as this. Unfortunately Wellington City Council seems to have "limited ability to direct Wellington Electricity to fix their network faults". This situation seems untenable, and this has been made very clear to Council.



The latest communication from Council advises that their new head of Transport and Infrastructure is meeting with Wellington Electricity to "establish a much better coordination and arrangement for the benefit of all Wellingtonians". One hopes this means that greater pressure will be exerted on Wellington Electricity to remedy situations like this within an acceptable time frame. In this particular instance these lights have been out of action for far too long!

## WATER TREATMENT STATION BY THE FIRE STATION

We ran an article in the April edition of this newsletter about the new community water stations currently being set up by Wellingon Water in Tawa and other parts of Wellington.

12 community water stations will be located in parks, schools, and streets across Wellington city, with three of those in the Tawa area. Water stations will be used to store, treat and distribute emergency water which will be available *from* day eight after a significant earthquake event. The water distribution network across Wellington will provide 20 litres of water for each person, each day.

It is UP TO YOU to make provision for your household for the first seven days!

Work has been in progress for some time in setting up the water treatment station at the site alongside the Tawa Fire Station in Lyndhurst Road. We were recently informed that "the first of Tawa's three water treatment stations has landed at the fire station as the commissioning progresses." See the lower pic.

#### **CONGRATULATIONS TO TODD MORTON**

Absolutely Positively Wellingtonian awards were presented at an event at City Gallery Wellington on a recent Wednesday evening. The 13 recipients were awarded their certificates by Mayor Justin Lester. One of that number was Tawa's Todd Morton who runs Easyswim Swim School.

His citation reads as follows:

"Todd owns Easyswim Swim School, which has been running in the northern suburbs' school pools for 12 years, and has taught children as young as three months through to adults how to swim.

The business is not about profit for Todd, he just loves seeing children progress and swim well. He supports and runs annual triathlons and swimming sports at schools, where the entry fee goes to the school.



Over the years Easyswim has supported local kindergartens and school fundraising efforts, which has helped hundreds of children to improve their water skills.

A significant amount of effort is put into the quality of school swimming lessons, and Todd works with the schools to ensure the lessons are affordable.

Todd goes above and beyond what is expected and is always improving his programmes to incorporate different aspects of water safety.



This includes running programmes at Titahi Bay beach so children can practise their skills in the ocean, and the Arctic Challenge, where children have to swim in a much colder pool to simulate ocean water. To support this, Todd has installed a water shower device over the pools to simulate sea spray.

Running a school pool is expensive. The rent that Easyswim pays and their pool maintenance means the schools involved can afford to keep their pools operating."



### **Seniors Driving Course**


