OUTER GREEN BELT PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Public consultation is under way on the Draft Outer Green Belt Management Plan 2019. The deadline for feedback is 5pm on Monday 25 March.

On the WCC website: "The Outer Green Belt is a series of reserves on the edge of the city that stretch from the Porirua City boundary to the south coast [of Wellington]. It covers more than 3,000 hectares and comprises over half of the City's public reserves network." This includes Spicer Forest and Te Ngahere-o-Tawa (formerly Forest of Tane) on Tawa's western hills.

SH1 PORIRUA - LINDEN CLOSURES DIVERSION THROUGH TAWA

Throughout March and April, the Transmission Gully team are lifting and placing bridge beams onto the new bridges over SH1 between Porirua and Linden.

During this time, we will also occasionally need to close one direction of SH1 between Tawa and Porirua for night time traffic. When this happens we will implement a diversion through Tawa.


When a diversion through Tawa is in place, you may notice an increase in traffic and slightly more noise than you are used to. To minimise impact on residents, any diversion through Tawa and Porirua will be between 11pm and 3am when traffic flows are very low. The first diversion will be on the night of Wednesday 13 March.

We appreciate your patience while this critical stage of work is completed for the Transmission Gully Motorway.
