## NZ POST TO TRIAL ELECTRIC DELIVERY VEHICLES IN TAWA

You may have noticed NZ Post's Paxsters delivering the mail in Tawa recently.

*This is the official blurb:*

“Council has given approval for NZ Post to trial electric delivery vehicles ('Paxsters') in Tawa for 12 months starting in February 2019.

NZ Post uses Paxsters in other parts of the country to improve mail delivery services which are seeing many more parcels instead of letters, as electronic communication becomes the norm. So posties need help to deliver these heavier and bigger items. The Paxsters will ride on footpaths where practicable to give the most efficient service direct to people's mail boxes.

Northern Ward and Transport Portfolio Councillors, together with Tawa Community Board, support the trial.

## NZ POST TO TRIAL ELECTRIC DELIVERY VEHICLES IN TAWA (contd)

### KEY MESSAGES:

- The Tawa trial authorises Paxsters to operate in all streets except Tawa Shopping Centre.
- Some footpaths will be unsuitable because they are too narrow or have obstructions such as power poles.
- The speed limit will be 15 kilometres an hour and the vehicles will need to give way to pedestrians.
- NZ Post has a comprehensive operating protocol in place for Paxsters, focused on safety.
- Around 70% of local authorities have now agreed that Paxsters can be used in their areas. This includes Auckland, Christchurch, Hamilton and Dunedin.
- No other Wellington suburbs are assessed by NZ Post as suitable for Paxsters.
- NZ Post will carry out comprehensive communication with local residents, businesses and other stakeholders prior to their introduction.”



In July 2017 this newsletter ran an article headed “Paxsters in Tawa?” Members of the Tawa Community Board at that stage saw a Paxster in action (a demonstration) on a Saturday afternoon in Brasenose Place. 18 months later they are on our streets (and footpaths). The wheels of bureaucracy turn slowly!
