NEIGHBOURLY ALMOST AT THE 2000 MARK!

Some time within the first half of November the Neighbourly website will see its 2000th member sign up in Tawa. An outstanding achievement!

Neighbourly is operating in around 1800 different suburbs throughout the whole country. And you may be aware that Tawa has more members than any other suburb in New Zealand, something of which we can be very proud!

At the time of going "to print" we had 1980 members. We're currently gaining 2-3 new members each day, meaning that Tawa is likely to reach 2000 between 5th and 12th November.

We were asked recently, "What good things have you seen in Tawa as a result of having such a strong Neighbourly community?"

We answered that one specific community project to have come out of Neighbourly is its recently-commenced community garden. Discussion on that topic had started on the website twelve months earlier. Interested parties subsequently met in person and took it from there. Many months later, after numerous meetings and online discussions, the first seeds were sown (literally) in the garden earlier this month. That news featured in the most recent edition of this newsletter.

We have also had two Neighbourly get-togethers in person in the past twelve months, one involving 85 people, the other 150.

And a few months ago Council proposed getting rid of the flowers on the "BP roundabout" (corner

of the Main Road / Tawa St / The Drive. Drainage issues meant that it probably would have been less expensive to completely concrete the roundabout than to sort out the drainage problems, thereby ensuring the flowers could stay.

The issue was discussed on Neighbourly with a total of 40 people expressing an opinion. All bar two wanted the flowers retained. The strength of community feeling was conveyed to Council who agreed that, yes, they would find a way to return the flowers! And so it came to be (as in the pic).
