## TAWA COMMUNITY BOARD BY-ELECTION - STILL TIME TO VOTE!

If you haven't already voted in the by-election, it's not too late! But you might need to drop off your voting papers to the Mervyn Kemp Library to be on the safe side (or at the City Service Centre, 101 Wakefield St, Wellington). You have until 12 noon on Saturday in which to do so. If you post your papers on Friday, they may or may not get to the Council in time. And for the record, an article "posted" on the Council's website today (Thursday 19th) states that at this stage just short of 29% of voting papers had been returned. Anyway thank you to those who have made the effort to vote. I would imagine that a somewhat higher percentage than 33-35% of the recipients of this newsletter have voted in the by-election because, presumably, you do have a (profound!) interest in the life of this community and in the Community Board which acts as our mouthpiece to the City Council (or something like that!).

The by-election result may well be determined before the end of Saturday afternoon. I will notify you of the outcome as soon as I'm able to do so, whichever of the eight candidates wins.
