# A WIN IN THE BY-ELECTION; A LOSS OF THE ROLE AS COMMUNITY CENTRE COORDINATOR

As you will probably be aware, Malcolm Sparrow (the writer of this newsletter) won the by-election for a place on the Tawa Community Board. I will be officially sworn in at the next Board meeting on Thursday 10 December. As the Council believes there would be a conflict of interest in regard to my role as coordinator at the Tawa Community Centre, I am resigning that position.

My decision to stand in the by-election, knowing that a win would mean the end of my time at the Centre, was not made lightly. It is with a huge amount of regret that I am stepping down. As I said in my election circular, "I am very much involved in and committed to this community ..." Because circumstances have limited what I could achieve at the Centre, I stood for the Board to allow me to continue in an "official capacity" in the community. It had always been my intention to stay and see the Community Centre develop and expand, and hopefully I can help that happen in my new role with the Community Board.

Looking back, I am pleased to have got to know a lot more local people whilst at the Centre. I have also had the privilege of dealing with (and in many cases, "becoming friends with") Tawa residents from a variety of backgrounds whom I might not have otherwise met - Sri Lankans, Filipinos, Maori, Samoans, Fijians, Indians, Cook Islanders, Kiribati, Maltese, etc. The pot luck meals we held every three months were a good chance to mix with a wide range of members of our community. Thank you to those who contributed to seeing our pot luck meals well-attended and well worthwhile.

I would also like to thank the team of volunteers who regularly serve at the Centre for a couple of hours every week. They're primarily retired people who lead active lives and contribute to the community in many ways, not least their involvement at the Centre.

Tawa has a huge amount going for it. I am impressed by ...

- the fact that there are more than 130 clubs & groups based in Tawa/Linden catering for a wide range of interests
- how well the schools here work together, culminating in the Tawa Schools' & Community Festival every two years
- the number of people involved in the various churches, including three church groups who meet at the Centre
- how large and effective the local U3A group is, catering for hundreds of seniors

I have asked a number of locals in recent months what they like about Tawa and one answer that invariably comes through is the "sense of community", the village feel, etc. My aim, amongst other things, is to do the best I can in continuing to develop and improve that.

The Tawa Community Board is Tawa's mouthpiece in dealing with the Wellington City Council. "We can go in to bat for you!" is the catchery. The Board is currently putting
